With gratitude to God and as an expression of your personal commitment to Jesus Christ, we ask you to examine who you are, and to prayerfully consider in what ways you might help to change lives.

Tithing is choosing an amount of money to be automatically earmarked for your giving. For some, making use of an envelope system helps them to make this commitment. For others, a direct deposit each week or fortnight or month ensures that they don't forget. And you always have the option of giving directly each week in our church services. A regular tithe allows the church to make plans beyond the next week or so.

When thinking about money, consider that a cup of coffee a day probably equates to \$15 per week. If you gave up that coffee, could you spare that \$15 for something whose benefits extend a lot further than the café? Some people have the capacity to give considerably more than the price of a coffee. How about you?

Once you have an idea of how much you are able to give, you can help church planning considerably by letting us know. That way we know how bold we can be when ministry opportunities come our way. You don't need to include your name, but if you do, your name and your pledge will be kept strictly confidential.
